MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

On the occasion of the Lebanese Maronite Order's 324 year anniversary, the Most Reverend Abbot Naamtallah Hashem addressed the Lebanese Maronite Order when they were celebrating the feast of the establishment on the 10th of November at Saint Maroun's Monastery in Annaya.

Here is a brief summary of what he spoke about: "we are celebrating this year and enter the 325 year Jubilee. This is a remarkable milestone for the Order and this year is also marked by 100 years Anniversary of the Great Lebanon Foundation. This year will be dedicated to our stewardship Patron – "Blessed Estephan." We seize his message of relying on God who is always protecting us and our country Lebanon through increased prayer.

Before the current Lebanon establishment there was the Lebanese Maronite Order. The LMO accompanied and followed the Lebanese people to serve them in diaspora. Where her foundation and roots are in the East, they are extended to all the continents of the world.

The LMO carries Lebanon's mission and identity in particular through our Patron saints, St Maroun and mainly St Charbel who is known everywhere around the world. He is known as "the Lebanese Saint."

We have to work without fear, through love taking on responsibility as an individual like Jesus and St Charbel that has progressed our mission. Current situations in Lebanon has left no security for anyone on any level, but this should let us emphasise our focus on our mission as Monks to continue to focus on our identity and our faith.

Brother Estephan lived a life of famine and intense prayer. This is what we can offer to our people and our country. Lebanon's crisis is because of the lack of trust and faith in the country's management. This is irreparable without bringing back hope and trust. We must all preserve our relationship with God and continue to maintain our trust in Him, for without God, there is no way for salvation.

It is our duty as Christians to do our best to save people through their faith and trust, and to always trust in God and in us, as monks and followers of our patrons, St Maroun, St Charbel and Blessed Estephan.

It is important to remember that St Charbel never tried to sort out issues but he worked on himself. He took responsibility and he changed himself through his own responsibility of his sanctity and his life. This is how he made a difference and has touched believers and non- believers worldwide.

Corruption and sanctity don't go together. We must fight against corruption as Blessed Estephan says, "God is seeing me." We must remember that we are working under God's eyes and through Him – let us spread this message to all through our faith and our actions.

Our history as the Lebanese Maronite Order is coloured with persecution and blood and this continues in Lebanon today. But it has been during persecution that our Saints have appeared more than ever before. Through our prayers and trust, they will lead Lebanon to peace, and lead us as monks to continue to be faithful to our mission and to our people."

Our Most Rev. Abbot has invited us to live out our poverty and to share with our brothers and sisters who are in need like Blessed Estephan. He has also invited us to work particularly in laboring of the land, like Blessed Estephan and to encourage those around us to return to the fields of sweat, blood and tears and offer up this to our Lord to move away from politics, from materialism and to return to God in faith, hope and love. The more we give, the more we will be rewarded.

We also congratulate Brother Hanna – Primary College Chaplain, who was ordained last night as Sub Deacon by His Excellency Bishop Antoine-Charbel Tarabay. We pray that Brother Hanna will continue in our mission of faith.

The K-6 students have been going to swimming lessons this week. These lessons are not aimed at teaching the children how to swim, because many weeks of swimming, if not months, would be required to do this. The aim is to introduce students to the basics of swimming so they will be safe around water.

There has been hot weather about lately. During hot weather the College does everything that it can to ensure the students are safe and comfortable, including allowing them to drink water and refill their water bottles when needed. If the weather is unduly hot, then the children will be kept indoors at recess and lunch. In making the decision to keep children inside, staff will go out into the playground and see what the actual weather is like. While the outdoor heat might seem excessive to parents who come from cool air conditioned homes to collect their children, the students are sitting in classrooms all day which, despite air conditioning, can still become very hot and stifling in extreme heat. So sometimes it's necessary for the children to be outside for a short amount of time where at least they can get some fresh air and stretch their legs. In the event that the air is hazy due to bush fires, asthmatics will be kept indoors.

An invitation will be going home to parents this week regarding the end of year assembly on Wednesday 11 December, starting at 10 am in the multi-purpose hall. Parents are welcome to attend and can take their children home following the assembly. Otherwise students will finish at the usual time of 3.10 pm.






