

Parent Teacher Report Interviews, Year 10 work experience, Athletics Carnival, VET work placements as well as excursions and sporting events - teachers and students alike have been working at a frenetic pace, and I know they will all appreciate the upcoming holidays which will give everyone an opportunity to recharge their 'batteries.'

Please encourage your children to return the library books for the end of the term and continue to ensure your child brings their library card everyday to school to enable them to borrow books from the library and print.


### **Arabic Story Time**
